The first public meeting for the Illinois Route 2 Phase I Study was held on Thursday, August 5, 2010 at EIGERlab, 605 Fulton Street, Rockford, Illinois from 1:00pm – 6:00pm. The meeting was held in an open house format with exhibit boards for review and the opportunity for attendees to provide comments, suggestions, issues and concerns.

The intent of the meeting was to inform the public that a study of the N. Main Street (IL 2) corridor from north of Auburn Street to north of Riverside Boulevard was being initiated and would be done utilizing IDOT's Context Sensitive Solutions (CSS) process. In addition, a goal of the meeting was to inform stakeholders of the opportunity to serve as a Community Advisory Group (CAG) member.

It should be noted that the meeting was not intended to present proposed improvements for the corridor to the public. The study is in the beginning stages, and proposed improvements have not yet been identified. For this reason, the exhibit boards displayed existing conditions only. One provided aerial plan view of the corridor (see Attachment 1), and another provided cross sections of the existing roadway (see Attachment 2). Also available was a location map displaying the project limits (see Attachment 3).

Handouts included a newsletter (see Attachment 4) describing the project and the study process. It contained a Comment Form for stakeholders to complete and submit either at the meeting or by mail. Also available as a handout was an information sheet that contained facts and a glossary of terms (see Attachment 5).

Notice of the meeting was sent to 217 stakeholders (see Attachment 6 for mailing list) and was also advertised in the Rockford Register on July 22 and July 29, 2010 (see Attachment 7). In addition, a press release announcing the meeting was issued (see Attachment 8).

**Public Comment:**

The public was invited to submit comments about the project via comment form or mail. Comments received by August 20, 2010 will become part of the official public meeting record.

Sixteen (16) comment forms were received on August 5, 2010 at the Public Meeting. No additional forms were submitted through the mail.

In general those in attendance at the meeting expressed support for improvements to the corridor. It was the impression of several that the meeting was being held at least in part to discuss upcoming improvements for the intersection of N. Main and Street. It was explained that this is not the case and that the project they had in mind was being administered by the City of Rockford. In addition, some believed that the meeting was intended for an upcoming resurfacing project along N. Main Street in this area. It was pointed out that the resurfacing project is an interim effort to maintain pavement conditions until more extensive improvements can be accomplished.

The issues and concerns expressed either verbally to the Project Study Team or through formal comment forms included the following topics:

- Adjusting and adding turn lanes and signal lights
- Drainage
- Accessibility to businesses during construction
- Safety
- Prior studies
- Interest in joining the Community Advisory Group

The submitted comment forms are included in Attachment 10. As evidenced by those forms, fifteen stakeholders expressed interest in joining the Citizen Advisory Group.

Notable verbal comments are summarized as follows:

Senator Dave Syverson: Feels the project should be kept simple and limited to widening where the lanes are narrow, fixing the curve at Brown Avenue and providing a new driving surface.

Tom Rotello: Owner of Olympic Tavern. Noted that a major renovation is forthcoming for the restaurant. A primary concern for the project is the lack of space between the N. Main & Fulton curbs and the building face. This is a problem especially in inclement weather (i.e. no place to pile snow, patrons are splashed by passing cars in rainy weather). Is aware of the City's Envision Study & pointed out that the document lists the Olympic Tavern as a landmark recommended for avoidance.



Zak Rotello: Echoed the sentiments of his father, Tom. Also called attention to the discontinuity of the existing sidewalk & noted that as a significant concern. Noted he is a bicyclist pointed to the lack of bicycle facilities along the corridor. He added, however, that he believes it would not be feasible to accommodate bicycles along N. Main Street.

Dick Berman: Resident along Country Club Beach Road. He indicated he would like to see different access to N. Main for his neighborhood. He feels Halsted is the best opportunity from the standpoint that it is closer in elevation to Country Club Beach Road than is Belmont. He also feels the signals at N. Main and Halsted would provide for better accessibility. Based on past interaction with the railroad, he believes the concept of a new crossing might be well received.

Alberto Altamore: Owns Altamore restaurant south of Auburn Street as well as several other properties in that area. His primary concern is the curve at Brown Avenue. Another concern is the need to improve the Fulton Avenue intersection with turning lanes. He is aware of the City's Envision study and is in favor of the recommendations put forth in it regarding a raised median with plantings.


Ray Streit: Home owner north of the railroad. He suggested a need for signals at Pierce Avenue and cited difficulties for motorists turning left from Pierce or crossing to the business on the east side of the intersection.

Gary McIntyre: Planner for RMAP. His duties include bicycle and mass transit planning. Noted he is an avid bicyclist and lives in the area. He was involved in establishing a shared bike lane along Huffman (west of N. Main) south of Fulton. He will provide information regarding existing and proposed bicycle accommodations for the area. He pointed out that he does not feel N. Main is a viable route for accommodating bicycles. He feels parallel routes are more appropriate. When asked, he indicated Brown Park is not a pedestrian/bicycle destination. He urged that we also consider mass transit and suggested coordination with mass transit officials.





AVERAGE DAILY TRAFFIC (ADT) AS VEHICLES PER DAY (VPD)	2015 (2035) YEAR





AND AVERAGE DAILY TRAFFIC




EXISTING TYPICAL SECTION





## ON BEHALF OF IDOT

This information is published on behalf of the Illinois Department of Transportation, District 2, to assist citizens in understanding the various elements of the project from earliest concepts to the completion of the roadway. This information allows you to learn about what has been done thus far, and what remains to be done to allow us to construct the project.

We, as a Department, hope you will find this handout useful and that it will help you understand what it takes to study, design, and construct a highway project. This handout should help answer some of the most commonly asked questions by the public regarding a project.



### YEAR ONE — FEASIBILITY STUDY

A feasibility study is typically initiated to assess whether or not a proposed highway improvement warrants further study or whether additional Phase I Engineering Studies are needed. Feasibility studies typically are conducted to address the following types of questions.

- Will a new highway or major river bridge promote economic development in a certain region of the State and create more benefits than costs, or would upgrading existing highways be a better solution for satisfying State and local needs?
- Is a missing link of a four-lane highway causing traffic

operational problems which, in turn, are creating a high number of accidents?

- Would it be possible and cost effective to build a new four-lane highway on new alignment through rugged terrain in comparison to upgrading the existing alignment?
- Other similar situations where additional information is needed before making a decision to proceed with more detailed engineering studies (e.g. major drainage alternatives, alternate locations for a proposed interchange).

## YEARS FIVE—SIX—PHASE III ENGINEERING

### CONTRACT PROPOSAL AND ADVERTISING FOR BIDS

After all the design plans and contract documents are completed, the construction improvement project is included on the Department's regularly scheduled advertisement for bids. All contractors must meet the Department's pre-qualification requirements.

The pre-qualification process reviews each contractor's experience;

quality and timeliness of previously constructed work, and the equipment and capital they have available to complete the project. This pre-qualification rating establishes the size of project each contractor is able to bid on and the type of work they are qualified to do (i.e. bridges, resurfacing, concrete paving, traffic signals, etc.). This helps to assure that the contractor is capable of completing the work in a

quality manner within the scheduled time limits.

All interested contractors are given four weeks to review the contract plans for the proposed project and prepare their bids to complete the work. The sealed bids are then reviewed at the scheduled bid opening. The contract is then awarded to the lowest bidder on the project who meets all the contract requirements and pre-qualifications.

### CONTRACT AWARDED: CONSTRUCTION BEGINS

During construction of the project, the Department inspects all materials used in the improvement, monitors the contractor's operation to ensure all specifications are followed, and completes all the required documentation

Materials inspection involves testing and



approval of all items used on the contract. This includes all aggregates, concrete, asphalt, culverts, traffic signals and metal products. Everything from trees and topsoil to pavement marking paint, must meet specifications before it can be used on the project.



## YEAR FOUR—PHASE II ENGINEERING

### PLAN DEVELOPMENT STAGE

The designer is responsible for preparing the final plans so that they can be constructed. To ensure the plans are correct and complete, the designer will review the Phase I report and the project commitment files. The plans are reviewed at the preliminary, pre-final, and/or final stages to ensure that they are free from errors and omissions.

Preliminary Plan Review. This is the stage that various bureaus, sections, agencies, etc. have a chance to conduct an overall review of the plans. The preliminary plan review will occur after the designer has essentially completed the plans including the cover sheets, plan and profile sheets, detail sheets, cross section sheets, determined pay items, special provisions, etc.

During this stage the designer will address any utility conflicts and determine if adjustments and/or relocations are necessary. For major projects, several reviews may be necessary to avoid having to make substantial changes later in the plan preparation process.

### LAND ACQUISITION

This phase is where the amount of right-of-way and easements are determined. Once the amount of property is determined, an appraiser will determine the value of the property we are going to acquire and the effect it will have on the remaining parcel. When the appraisal has been completed, it is then given to a negotiator who will meet with the prop-

erty owner and discuss the value of the property. After the price has been set, either by negotiation or determined by a court, the sale of the parcel is completed and the transfer of the land is recorded. Another part of the land acquisition activity is relocation assistance for persons in legal physical possession of the real estate acquired, which may be tenants or owner/

occupants. Those occupants may be residents, businesses (including farms and non-profit organizations), or just personal property that needs to be moved. In any case, anyone displaced by acquisition will be afforded relocation assistance.

### UTILITY WORK

Utility coordination starts in Phase I where preliminary plans are provided to the utility owners. The utility owners mark their locations on the plans and return them to IDOT, where they are incorporated into the project files. The designer will do their best to minimize

impacts to the utilities. Pre-final plans are then sent to the utilities so they can design the relocation of the facilities being impacted. Final plans are sent out with a 15 day notice to submit for a permit. This is done when the project is submitted for letting. Once the per-

mit is approved and the new right-of-way purchased, the utilities have 90 days to complete the relocation. If the proper coordination is not done between IDOT and the utilities, it could effect the timing of the project.



## *IL Route 2 (North Main Street) Public Awareness Meeting August 5, 2010*

The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) is initiating the IL Route 2 (North Main Street), from Auburn Street to Riverside Boulevard, Phase 1 Study. The IL Route 2 study area is comprised of approximately 2.0 miles located between north of Auburn Street on the south and north of Riverside Boulevard on the north, within the City of Rockford. The study will take a detailed look at the current and future transportation needs of the corridor and will involve a public involvement process.

IDOT encourages your input throughout the study process of this project. Please place your comment forms in the boxes marked COMMENTS, or fold in thirds, tape closed, place a stamp and mail.

## YEAR TWO-THREE — PHASE I STUDIES & ENGINEERING

### SCOPE

Phase I Studies include both Engineering and Environmental Studies, each requiring a separate decision-making process.

Phase I work can vary from a very minor type study to an in-depth investigation of corridors, alternative alignments and cross sections, different highway types, and other design features with consideration of social, economic, environmental, and engineering factors.

### PURPOSE

Phase I studies are developed to ensure that, as practical, highway locations and proposed designs are consistent with Federal, State, and local goals and objectives. The following are considered when performing a Phase I study:

1. Design Uniformity: to ensure that the proposed improvement will satisfy a need and that uniform designs are used Statewide.
2. Public Involvement:

develop the final design with input from the general public. (This is the stage of the project which we are in now.)

3. Public Interest Consideration: make final project decisions in the best overall public interest.
4. Adverse Effects of Project: ensure that the potential adverse economic, social, and environmental effects of proposed action have been fully considered.

## SOCIAL, ECONOMIC AND ENVIRONMENTAL CONSIDERATIONS

The following items are discussed when developing a highway improvement:

- Effects on regional and community growth
- Conservation and preservation of natural resources
- Public facilities, services, and recreational areas
- Community cohesion

- Displacement of people, businesses, and farms
  - Air, noise, and water pollution
  - Aesthetic value
- The depth of social, economic, and environmental analysis will vary depending upon the scope and nature of the project, the stage of project development, and magnitude of any adverse impacts. For major

projects, the District will prepare a separate environmental document, i.e., an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) or an Environmental Assessment (EA). For most projects the Project Report will document the environmental analysis.

## DESIGN AND ENGINEERING CONSIDERATIONS

Phase I studies are used to identify the following:

- Need for highway improvement
- Capacity deficiencies
- Need to improve safety

- Project termini
- Typical Section
- Need for right-of-way
- Drainage concerns
- Location of traffic

- control devices
- Project Cost

The scope and depth of engineering analyses will vary depending on the scope of work.

### Review of Accident Data:

During the 5 year period of 2004 to 2008 there were 60 injury crashes (1 Fatal, 10 A injuries, and 49 B injuries). There is a trend downward in the number of injuries with a yearly breakdown as follows.

2004 – 1 Fatal, 5 A's, 14 B's (20 total)  
2005 – 11 B's (11 total)  
2006 – 2 A's, 9 B's (11 total)  
2007 – 1 A, 9 B's (10 total)  
2008 – 2 A's, 6 B's (8 total)

A injuries are Incapacitating/Life Threatening; B injuries are Non-Incapacitating

### Glossary of Terms:

**Context Sensitive Solutions (CSS)** – A process that provides balance between mobility, community needs and the environment while developing transportation projects. This is achieved through involving stakeholders early and continuously, addressing all modes of transportation, applying flexibility in the design, and incorporating aesthetics into the overall project.

**Stakeholder** – An individual or group with an interest or investment in certain project decisions.

**Stakeholder Involvement Plan (SIP)** – An element of CSS that facilitates effective identification and understanding of the concerns and values of all stakeholders as an integral part of the project development process. It includes a formal written plan explaining how public input and comments will be obtained.

**Project Study Group (PSG)** – A group of professionals representing specific technical or scientific disciplines who are brought together for a designated period of time to perform detailed analysis. PSG members have environmental, engineering and project development expertise.

**Citizens Advisory Group (CAG)** – A group of residents, community leaders, and public officials, representing the population of the study area, who assist in formulating transportation planning goals and objectives, evaluating alternative plans, selecting recommended courses of action, and setting priorities. They represent community interests and contribute valuable information to project sponsors about the location, design, and implementation of proposed transportation improvements.

**Consensus** – When a majority agrees upon a particular course of action, while the dissenting remainder agrees that their input has been heard and duly considered and that the process as a whole was fair.

**Context** – 1) The interrelated condition in which something exists (the visible and invisible), 2) Weaving parts into a whole.

**Community Context Audit** – A formal process of evaluating various community characteristics that make each transportation project location unique to its residents, its businesses and the public in general.

Subj: Civil Rights Violation Promulgated by the City of Rockford Police Department  
And the City Of Rockford Legal Department

1. On 14 April 2006, I opened JT's Bourbon Street Grille, in Rockford, Illinois. Two months after I opened the establishment, 2 June, 2006, the City of Rockford Police and Fire Department entered JT's Bourbon Street Grille, and began to verbally harass me in front of my employees and my patrons. We were hosting a Family Reunion that night and it was our first busy night. See enclosure (1) Police Complaint. On 5 July 2006, the Community Liaison, Officer Jason Mallo told me that Deputy Chief Booker recommended that I use the cover charge and hire Security to take care of the City Municipal parking lot, in which we hired Merchant Police for Security which was strongly recommended.
2. Nearly a year later, Merchant Police, (Larry Hodges), increased their fees, and when I did not readily agree, they quit. Larry Hodges mentioned that he needed \$2 million for insurance or something to that affect. I then hired another Security Co, SPI. They were definitely treated with indifference by the Rockford Police Department, in comparison to the treatment that the Merchant Police received. Two weeks after hiring SPI, the Rockford Police stormed into my establishment, and vehemently accused us of having patrons drinking after 2:00 a.m. in which no one was drinking. I strongly feel that the Police would have never stormed into my establishment had we continued to use the services of Merchant Police. See enclosure (2). Police Harassment Complaint filed with the City of Rockford.
3. After that incident, we were summoned to meet with the City Attorney, Jennifer Cacciapaglia and the Community Liaison, Officer Matthew Krantz, on 3 June, 2007. The City Attorney was definitely aware of our business hours, business practices, our floor plan and the fact that we were charging a cover to help pay for security in the parking lot. Her main concern was security, specifically, Merchant Police, (Larry Hodges). I told her that we had SPI Security, she then made a statement, " You get what you pay for," indicating to me that SPI was inferior to Merchant Police. Never once did she mention our business hours or that we were operating a Nightclub. The City Attorney demanded that we provide them with a Security plan, which we did, however, when I tried to call the Parking Lot Supervisors, they never returned my calls. Eventually, I met the Parking Lot Supervisor at that time, Patty Castry, whom happened to live across the street from

JT's Bourbon Street Grille. When I mentioned preventive measures to secure the Parking Lot, she told me, "you can't do that, you can't do that, THIS IS MY PARKING LOT!" She later put up the 'Do Not Back Into Stalls' in the parking lot and told me that it wasn't intended to harass my customers. (I had met with Ms. Castry prior to JT's Grand Opening for she owned a Sign Company and I wanted to replace the signage on the Building. She said she would call and give me an estimate on the cost, but she never called me back.)

4. On 2 August, 2007, I met with Alderman Doug Mark, and discussed loud music emanating from cars driving through the parking lot. He told me to take down the license plate number and a description of the persons and the vehicle and that he would pick the information up from me on the following Thursday. Our Security Guards took down the information, however, Mr. Marks never returned to pick up the folder. Mr. Marks was fully aware of our business hours and business practices, and he never mentioned that I was operating a Nightclub. On 20 December, I had another meeting with Alderman Doug Mark concerning a meeting that was to take place with Deputy Chief Booker as a result of the findings of the police complaint that I filed in July, 2007. See Enclosures. (Mr. Marks is also the Alderman who push the motion at the City Council to revoke my Special use Permit to serve alcohol in which I am currently undergoing.)

5. In January 2008, I met with Deputy Chief Booker to discuss the harsh tactics of the Rockford Police in dealing with my establishment. I mentioned to him the fact that the City put up signs in the Parking Lot, (Do Not Back Into Stalls), and that the parking Supervisor, Patty Castry, had stated that the signs were not put up to harass my customers, however, even on slow nights the police would come out and issue tickets. I told Deputy Chief Booker that when I tried to explain that to an officer issuing tickets, the officer replied, "well talk to Deputy Chief Booker, he's the one that told us to do it." (In June I spoke with a Parking Enforcement Official, and she told me, "the City doesn't even enforce the 'Do Not Back Into Stall' anymore, and that I should get a Lawyer.) I also mentioned to Deputy Chief Booker that whenever the City closes an African American establishment down, that they tend to chase those same individuals who were causing problems to my establishment, and that is when our problems begin. Deputy Chief Booker also spoke on the need for us to have Security, specifically Merchant Police, Larry Hodges. Currently, I am the only African American restaurant in the City of Rockford with a liquor license. The city has historically and systematically closed all the others down.

6. On 17 January 2008, the City Attorney issued a Revision of the Liquor Ordinance which states that 'Fees will be charged to a licensee for the second police response involving three or more police officers.' Immediately after issuing the new ordinance, on 20 January 2008, an establishment on the east side of town, the Colicm, had a shooting incident. And the following weekend, those same individuals, whom I weren't aware of at the time, came to my establishment. Two individuals were hiding behind a gas station at the opposite end of the parking lot waiting for someone to come out of JT's. Shortly, after closing, those individuals began firing at each other, shooting an innocent bystander

in the arm. I offered a \$2500 to identify the individuals involved. It was later brought to my attention that they were the same individuals involved at the Colicm the previous week. During the shooting investigation, Detective Mastroianni showed me an Official Police report stating that "Mr. Foreman said that a \$100,000 heroin deal had gone bad and that someone stole \$100,000," In which I never stated, and had no knowledge whatsoever about Heroin even existing in the City of Rockford. Prior to the shooting, I called the Legal Director, Patrick Hayes on 24 January 2008, because I was deeply concerned. Mr. Hayes never returned my phone call.

7. On 29 January 2008, the city suspended my license for 7 days without due process, citing grave concern. The city was required by law to give me a hearing within the first 7 days. They never gave me the hearing that I was entitled to. In place of a hearing, The Legal Department began a campaign of what appeared to be a series of measures to close down JT's Bourbon Street Grille. They required that I have another Building and Fire Inspection, which was shortly after the Building and Fire Inspectors had just closed down another establishment called Bar 3, on the eve of them having a Hip Hop artist perform. When my Attorney and I called the Zoning Department to find out what kind of inspection I was having, we were told that it was an 'All Trades' inspection. The Zoning official stated that, "I have never seen this one before," I then inquired with a representative from the Legal Department about an 'All Trades' inspection and was told, "The City doesn't do 'All Trades' inspections anymore. It was a code they used to close a business down." My lawyer, Ann Dempsey, inquired with the Legal Department on the reason for me having another Building Inspection, for I had already been inspected prior to opening, she was told that, "someone said that I had some illegal work done on my Hood, (Exhaust System), which I did not and provided proof. Then they said that, "I had done \$160,000 in renovations without a Permit" which was also untrue. Upon the City conducting another Building and Fire Inspection, it was required that I now had to spend several thousand dollars on things that I didn't need, i.e. replace water heaters, when our hot water supply was just fine.

8. After the suspension of JT's liquor license, I lost several key employees, and had to hire new Bartenders, Wait Staff and Cooks. In March 2008, we were included in a sting to check liquor establishments for selling alcohol to minors. Our new Bartender was told to make sure that he check ID cards for anyone appearing to be under the legal age of drinking. On that particular night, he asked the minor for his ID card, but stated that the minor took entirely too long to produce his ID. During that time, a cook came behind the bar to pour a soda. Another customer approached the bartender for a drink, and during that time the cook tried to help out the new bartender. The bartender told him to check the minors ID, in which the cook did, but said that he miscalculated the year. Furthermore, it was my first minor violation, and the penalty for another establishment whom had his 2<sup>nd</sup> minor violation was to close down for 1 day, and he had the opportunity to choose which day to close. The City closed me down for 3 days and specified that one of those days had to be a Thursday. Our cook was fined \$500 while other bartenders involved in the sting was fined \$300. It was also reported to me by my

staff that individuals whom they believed to be undercover police were asking them, "do they know where they can buy drugs?" inquiring specifically about the owner. I was even approached by a suspicious character trying to sell me Alcohol out of his trunk. There was another time that the police inquired of my brother about the walk-in cooler, stating, "Is that where he keep the drugs?" I have never in my life sold any drug whatsoever, and have tried to run a clean establishment.

9. In June 2008, the Mayor, Larry Morrissey, subpoenaed my Business records in which I was in the process of doing when the shooting occurred in the parking lot on 1 July 2008. I felt that the Mayor had gone above and beyond his legal authority, and that I should be focusing on running my establishment, and ensuring that undesirable individuals were not being permitted into JT's, for my office is in the basement, and I couldn't visually see all the customers entering my establishment that night. Furthermore, the shooting emanated from a parking lot across the street in which witnesses stated that a white Cutlass drove down the street and began shooting. I've cooperated fully with the Police Department to identify as many individuals involved in the altercation by providing them the video from that particular evening. It has been very difficult to operate JT's 100% effectively, after all the demands that the Legal Department have been initiating.

10. After renewing my license in April, as I did in the previous years, I was told that I had to apply for a Nightclub permit, and go through zoning again. I attended the Illinois Licensed Beverage Association meetings and was told that our Liquor License was under the Grandfather Clause. The City had changed the Liquor Ordinance, and that any new applicants would have to file under the new statutes, in addition, the new application states that, 'Will the licensee hire Certified Security upon the request of the Mayor?' I have the same Liquor License as my predecessors and they specifically ran a nightclub, and charged a cover, whereas my focus is on the restaurant primarily, and the bar, secondly. I paid \$10,000 for my liquor license, and the City never re-issued my license in May 2008 as they were required to do by law. That was a clear violation of my Right: The State of Illinois specifically states that the City cannot withhold a Liquor License without due process, in which the City had not given me a proper hearing at that time.

11. After the shooting incident on 1 July 2008, the city revoked my license. The shooting occurred in the parking lot across the street from my establishment. I provided the Rockford Police Department a video depicting the incident, it is not known that the individual was in my establishment that night, for witnesses stated that a car drove by and began shooting from the vehicle.

12. On 23 July 2008, I appealed the Mayors decision to revoke my liquor license to the Illinois Liquor Commission in Chicago. During the arguments, the City Attorney, Jennifer Cacciapaglia made a series of accusations to the Commissioners:

1. I charge a cover, (the state of Illinois allows a licensee to charge a cover).

2. That I don't allow anyone under 21 into my establishment after 10:00 p.m. (If a minor comes into my establishment with a responsible adult and I can monitor them, I will allow them to come in and have dinner. That should be my discretion.)
3. That I have Security and that I want patrons entering the establishment, (the City Attorney and the Deputy Chief strongly suggested that I have Security)
4. The Mayor believes that the Owner of the establishment is engaged in "ILLEGAL ACTIVITIES." ( It sounded as if the Mayor thinks I'm dealing in Drugs or something of that affect. I have never in my life sold a drug. I've spent 23 years in the Marine Corps, and 11 years in the Federal Government. The money I used to purchase this establishment was the money from the sale of my Co-op in Washington, DC, and the sale of a restaurant that I co-owned in Richmond, Va. with a Special Agent in the FBI. I've always felt as though I was being profiled as doing something illegal, and that is was based solely on the color of my skin.)

13. On 29 July 2008, my Attorney, Ann Dempsey, and I had a meeting with the City of Rockford's Legal Director, Patrick Hayes and the City Attorney, Jennifer Cacciagalia. Even though the Illinois Liquor Commission overturned the Mayors decision to revoke my Liquor License, The Legal Director told me that the Mayor, Larry Morrissey, did not want me to serve any alcohol at all. Thus, I was sternly warned that if I resume the sale of alcohol after the 30 day suspension of my liquor license posed on JT's Bourbon Street Grille by the Illinois Liquor Commission, which ends on 10 August 2008, "The Mayor will come down on me Major!" I took that as a serious threat, and I am terrified, for this City have been harsh on me every since I've opened. It is imperative that I operate JT's Bourbon Street Grille as a full service restaurant to include the sale of alcohol, in order to pay the tremendous overhead expenses. The establishment is a two-story building with a basement, with 5000 square feet on two levels, in which I've invested my whole life's savings. In addition, the City is in the process to revoking my special use permit to serve alcohol and they are also trying to take away my ability to serve food.

14. In closing, cooking has always been a passion of mine. At the age of 16, my first job was in a restaurant. And it was my intention to cook for the rest of my life after I got out of the Marine Corps. And after serving my country for 23 years, I should have every unalienable right to continue cooking. Thus, I feel that the City of Rockford revoked my license citing that I was operating an illegal Nightclub was erroneous. I feel offended by that word, for it is my intention to operate a Restaurant and a Bar. Other restaurants in Rockford charges a cover for entertainment and provides security. I feel as though I am being treated with indifference.

15. The 10<sup>th</sup> of August is approaching in less than two weeks, and my wait-staff is desperate and want to return to work, however, after the THREAT by the City of

Rockford's Legal Director, I am unsure of what to do. I understand that the shooting in the parking lot was a serious act, however, Rockford has the distinction of having the 2<sup>nd</sup> highest crime rate in the nation. And there has been shootings and even individuals being killed in several other liquor establishment, but their doors remain open to this day. No one has been killed in my establishment, or shot. The City of Rockford has also been sued for a form of discrimination in the Schools. Please contact Anthony S. Foreman at (540) 841- 9341, or (815) 964-4400. 5. Employees may check identification of persons whom they believe to be under the age of 21 at their discretion, but not as a regular practice at


entry to the Property.

- 7. The previously set August 19, 2008 deadline for renewal application of the liquor license issued to the Property is suspended. If the current pending sale of the Property does not go through, a new deadline for renewal application shall issue.
- 8. City staff shall request the pending application to revoke the Special Use Permit applicable to the Property be laid over to the September 16, 2008 Zoning Board of Appeals meeting.
- 9. Until such time as this order is amended, the Property shall operate pursuant to the terms articulated herein and in compliance with all state and local laws, including the terms of the Special Use Permit issued to the Property.




