



# ITEMS REVIEWED FOR ANALYSIS

## SOCIAL and ECONOMIC

### LAND USE

Identify types of land being affected by the project

### DISPLACEMENTS

#### RESIDENTIAL

How many residential properties are physically affected by the project

#### COMMERCIAL/ INDUSTRIAL

How many commercial properties are physically affected by the project

#### UTILITIES

What type of utilities may be physically affected by the project

### FARMLAND

Identify potential impact of farm operation by the project

### PUBLIC/ SEMI-PUBLIC LANDS

Identify potential impact to churches, special interest groups, car pool parking lots, etc. from the project

### COMMUNITY COHESION

Determine degree of disruption and impact on cohesion of any neighborhoods along project corridor.

## ENVIRONMENTAL

### AIR QUALITY

Potential impact on air quality from project

### NOISE

Potential impact on "sensitive receptors" (homes, churches, schools, and the library)

### 4(f)/6(f) LANDS

Potential impact on potential 4(f)/6(f) lands, including bike trails, parks, and historic properties, sites

### FLOODPLAINS

Potential impact on floodplain encroachment

### WETLANDS

Potential impact on wetlands

### WATER RESOURCES

Identify types of land being affected by the project

### THREATENED and ENDANGERED SPECIES

Potential impact on federal and state listed endangered species

### CULTURAL RESOURCES

Potential effects on NRHP sites or potential sites, such as cemeteries, archaeological sites and historical architectural sites

### HAZARDOUS WASTE

Potential costs and liabilities incurred from the acquisition of sites potentially containing hazardous materials

### VISUAL ENVIRONMENT

Potential effects of alternative alignments on existing visual environment

### PRIME FARMLAND

Potential conversion of prime and unique farmland and farmland of statewide or local importance

### NATURAL AREAS

Potential impacts to natural areas

### MINES and MINERAL RESOURCES

Proximity of project to mine shafts and potential impacts to existing mines and potential mineral resources.

### CRP/WRP LANDS and CENTENNIAL FARMS

Potential impacts to CRP/WRP lands and to centennial farms
