I-74 and I-57 patching to begin June 18

PARIS — The Illinois Department of Transportation announces that lane closures on Interstate 74 in Tilton and Fithian and I-57 near Rantoul will begin June 18.

The closures are necessary for crews to perform pavement patching. Work on I-74 will be between mile markers 213-215 in Tilton in both directions and mile markers 198-199 in Fithian in the westbound lanes. On I-57, patching will occur northbound from mile marker 243 to 246 and southbound from mile marker 247 to 248. One lane will remain open in each direction at all times during this work, which is expected to last about two weeks.

Motorists can expect delays and should allow extra time for trips through this area. To avoid the work area, when feasible, use of alternate routes should be considered. Drivers are urged to pay close attention to changed conditions and signs in the work zones, obey the posted speed limits, refrain from using mobile devices and be alert for workers and equipment.
