## **Resurfacing, Pedestrian Improvements along Ogden Avenue between Raymond Drive and Interstate 355**

**CHICAGO** – The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) announced that the resurfacing project on Ogden Avenue (U.S. 34) between Raymond Drive and Interstate 355, in Lisle and Naperville, will resume the week of Monday, March 19, weather permitting.

In order to complete the work, lane closures will take place in both directions on Ogden Avenue from Raymond Drive to west of I-355. The temporary lane closures will be necessary during day, night and weekend hours. Sidewalk closures will take place, as necessary, with detours for pedestrians.

The scope of the project consists of resurfacing, pavement marking, drainage repairs and installation of sidewalks that are compliant with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA). The overall project will improve mobility and pedestrian accessibility.

The project, which began in June 2017, is expected to be completed in Summer 2018.

Motorists can expect delays and should allow extra time for trips through this area. Drivers are urged to pay close attention to flaggers and signs in the work zones, obey the posted speed limits and be on the alert for workers and equipment.
