## **Illinois 120 Improvements at Greenleaf Avenue**

**CHICAGO** – The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) announced that lane closures will take place on Illinois 120 over the Canadian Pacific Railroad tracks and the Greenleaf Avenue ramps, in Gurnee, Waukegan and Park City, beginning, weather permitting, Monday, March 26. The lane closures are necessary for resurfacing and bridge rehabilitation of Illinois 120.

Beginning March 26, Illinois 120 will be reduced to one lane in each direction between O'Plaine Road and Greenleaf Avenue. The new traffic pattern includes both directions of Illinois 120 traffic placed in the eastbound lanes.

Beginning March 29, the ramp from Greenleaf Avenue to westbound Illinois 120 will be closed. A posted detour will direct traffic to take Washington Street to O'Plaine Road to access westbound Illinois 120.

The scope of the project includes resurfacing on Illinois 120 from the Canadian Pacific Railroad to just east of Greenleaf Avenue. The project also includes bridge rehabilitation of the Illinois 120 ramps over the railroad and Greenleaf Avenue, as well as overhead sign replacement along Illinois 120.

Motorists can expect delays and should allow extra time for trips through this area. Drivers are urged to pay close attention to flaggers and signs in the work zones, obey the posted speed limits and be on the alert for workers and equipment.
