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## **Illinois 120 Improvements at U.S. 41 in Park City**

**CHICAGO** – The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) announced that lane closures will take place on Illinois 120 over U.S. 41, in Park City, beginning, weather permitting, Monday, March 26. The closures are necessary for resurfacing and bridge rehabilitation of Illinois 120.

Beginning March 26, Illinois 120 will be reduced to one lane in each direction between Green Bay Road to Greenleaf Avenue. The new traffic pattern includes both directions of Illinois 120 traffic placed in the eastbound lanes. Temporary ramps will be used between westbound Illinois 120 and northbound U.S. 41.

The scope of the project includes bridge deck replacement and rehabilitation of the structures that carry Illinois 120 over U.S. 41 and the Union Pacific Railroad tracks. The project also includes new overhead signs along Illinois 120 and resurfacing between U. S. 41 and Knight Avenue.

Motorists can expect delays and should allow extra time for trips through this area. Drivers are urged to pay close attention to flaggers and signs in the work zones, obey the posted speed limits and be on the alert for workers and equipment.
