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Final Round of Traffic Impacts as part of the 41st Street Bridge Delivery

CHICAGO – The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) announced the next round of traffic impacts, as part of the delivery of the City of Chicago’s new 41st Street bridge, will take place, weather permitting, Friday, May 11, and Tuesday, May 15.

At approximately 9 p.m. Friday and Tuesday, two trucks hauling oversize bridge sections will leave Gilman, Illinois for Chicago and require lane closures along the permitted route to 41st Street and Lake Shore Drive. The bridge parts will be delivered on oversize load trucks that will block most of the roadway on the permitted route.

On Friday, May 11, the trucks will enter Cook County on northbound on I-57 and travel eastbound on U.S. 30, northbound Illinois 394 and northbound on the Bishop Ford Freeway to exit at Stony Island Avenue. The deliveries are expected to arrive on Lake Shore Drive by midnight.

On Tuesday, May 15, the trucks will take northbound I-57, northbound Interstate 94, exit on Pershing St/39th St, and travel on Cottage Grove Avenue to the jobsite.

Motorists can expect delays on these routes as the bridge sections travel through.

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
