## Schedule change for 167<sup>th</sup> Street repairs over I-57

**CHICAGO** – The Illinois Department of Transportation announced that improvements to the 167<sup>th</sup> Street bridge over Interstate 57, in Oak Forest and Country Club Hills, that began in April will continue with some upcoming changes to the schedule.

This project will be completed in several stages, requiring temporary, daytime lane closures on 167<sup>th</sup> Street and occasional overnight lane closures on I-57.

Now through late September, 167<sup>th</sup> Street will continue to be reduced to one lane in each direction over I-57. The eastbound 167<sup>th</sup> Street ramp to northbound I-57 will be closed, with a detour directing traffic to Crawford Avenue/Pulaski Road to access the interstate via 159<sup>th</sup> Street (U.S. 6). The southbound I-57 ramp to eastbound 167<sup>th</sup> Street also will be closed, with a detour directing traffic to the 159<sup>th</sup> Street exit to access 167<sup>th</sup> Street via Cicero Avenue (Illinois 50).

From late September to late November, 167<sup>th</sup> Street will remain one lane in each direction, but the westbound 167<sup>th</sup> Street ramp to southbound I-57 will be closed, with a detour directing traffic to Cicero Avenue and 159<sup>th</sup> Street to access the interstate. The northbound I-57 ramp to westbound 167<sup>th</sup> Street also will be closed, with a detour directing traffic to access 167<sup>th</sup> Street exit via the 159<sup>th</sup> Street interchange.

From late November to late December, all lanes and ramps will be open with intermittent, temporary closures at times to wrap up the project.

Motorists can expect delays and should allow extra time for trips through this area. Drivers are urged to pay close attention to flaggers and signs in the work zones, obey the posted speed limits and be on the alert for workers and equipment.
