

6/6 UPDATE: Due to inclement weather and continued rainy conditions this spring, the date for shifting traffic on Illinois 47 and closing Plato Road now is scheduled to take place June 24, weather permitting. The detour route also has been revised to direct traffic to Burlington and Dittman roads when the intersection of Plato Road and Illinois 47 is closed. The completion date remains unchanged at this time.

## **Illinois 47 and Plato Road roundabout construction**

**CHICAGO** – The Illinois Department of Transportation announced that the Illinois 47 and Plato Road intersection in Kane County will be reconstructed into a roundabout beginning, weather permitting, May 20.

In order to complete the project, traffic on Illinois 47 will be shifted to temporary pavement. Plato Road will be closed at Illinois 47 beginning in early June, with traffic detoured to Kendall Road, McDonald Road, Illinois 47 and Burlington Road.

The project is expected to be complete by October.

Motorists can expect delays and should allow extra time for trips through this area. Drivers are urged to pay close attention to flaggers and signs in the work zones, obey the posted speed limits and be on the alert for workers and equipment.
