

Public Meeting on June 5 for Proposed 95th Street, Stony Island Avenue Intersection Improvements

Chicago – The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) will host a public meeting Thursday, June 5, concerning the planning for the proposed intersection improvement of 95th Street (U.S. Route 12/20) and Stony Island Avenue in the City of Chicago. The general scope of work for this improvement consists of intersection reconstruction, bridge replacement, signal modernization, lighting improvements and drainage improvements. The public meeting will be conducted in an open-house format, meaning interested individuals can attend any time from 4 to 7 p.m.


