 - b. Do the available funding sources adequately fund your current and projected capital and operating needs? If not, please describe your current and projected shortfall.
 - c. Assuming no changes in current funding levels what steps will you take to address projected deficits in operating and capital budgets?
 - d. Do you think that the allocation formula appropriately apportions available funds? What changes, if any would you make to the existing formula and why?
