Introduction

On 22 February 2000, the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) requested that we monitor the avian fauna within the proposed Brown County Wetland Banking Site. We were asked to perform a Level 2 Wildlife Assessment as described in the Illinois Wetland Restoration and Creation Guide (Admiraal et al. 1997). Breeding season censuses at the banking site were to be conducted for five consecutive years. Reports detailing the first two years, 2000 and 2001, of monitoring were forwarded to IDOT on 5 January 2001 and 8 April 2002 respectively. In June 2002, IDOT instructed us to stop monitoring this site until further notice.

On 4 August 2003, IDOT tasked us to resume monitoring the avian fauna at this site, renamed the La Grange Wetland Banking Site (LGWBS), and to continue these surveys, expanded to include the spring and fall migration and winter seasons, at least until 2008 with annual reports due in March of each year. Because tasking was not received until June 2003, only the 2003 breeding and fall migration seasons were completed before the March report deadline. A four-season survey was conducted at the site each year since 2004. This report contains the results of the 2010-11 surveys. Steve Amundsen retired from his position and on June 1, 2010 the tasking was transferred to Wendy Schelsky.

Project Area

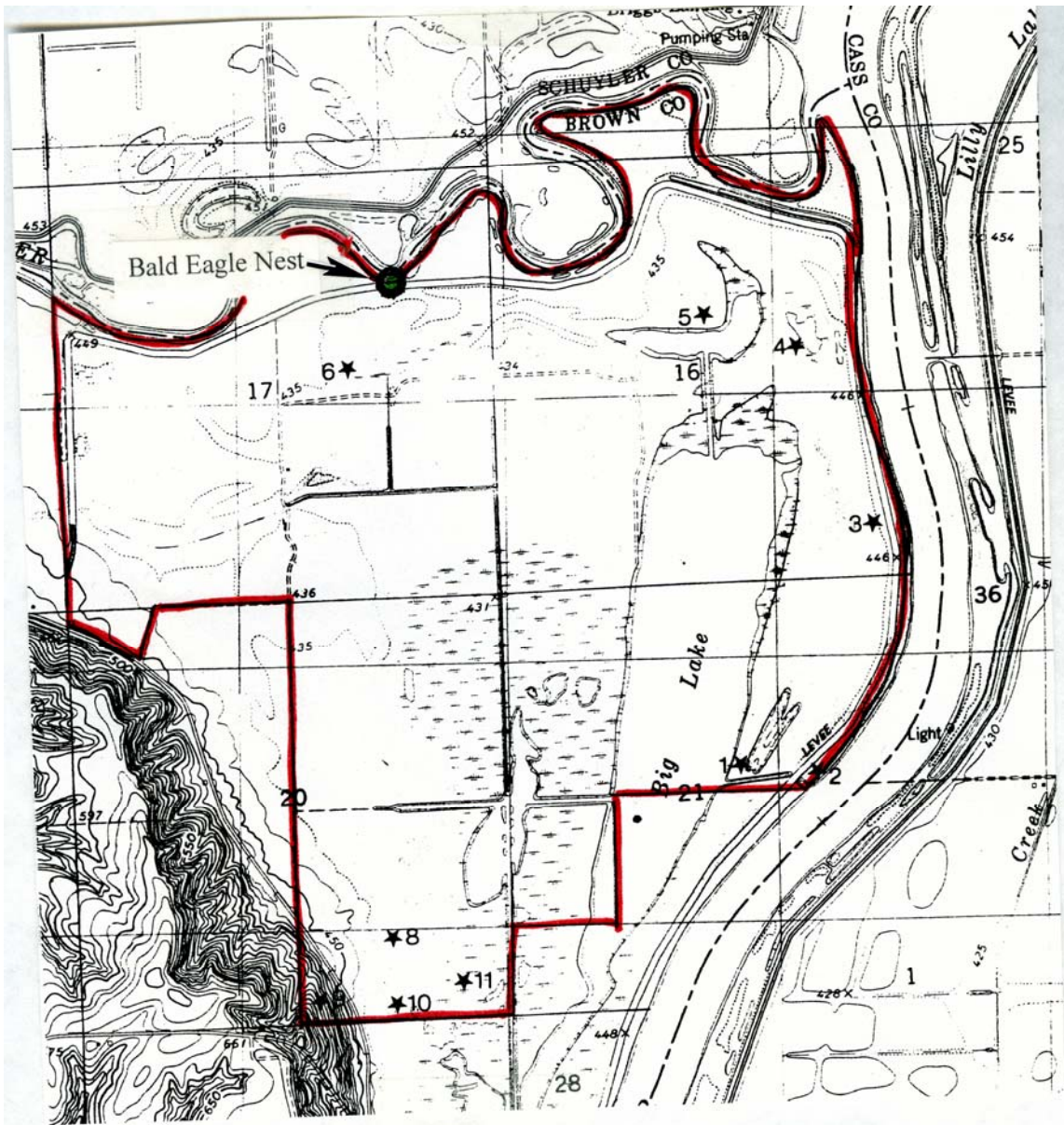


Figure 1. Location of the La Grange Wetland Bank Site project area, the census points used in the avian survey of the project area and the established Bald Eagle nest. The boundaries of the study area are highlighted in red.

The LGWBS is located in Brown County approximately 5 km southwest of Beardstown (Figure 1). It is bounded on the east by the Illinois River, to the north by the La Moine River, and on the south and west by various privately owned properties, and is approximately 667 ha (1648 acres) in area (Figure 1). Its legal location is:

ILLINOIS, Brown County. 3rd Principal Meridian: Township 1 South,
Range 1 West, portions of Sections 9,16,17, 20, and 21.

Much of the project area consists of former agricultural land that had been planted in row crops, mostly corn, in 2004. In 2005, acreage in row crops was greatly reduced and annual herbaceous plants covered much of the previously tilled land. In 2006, wetland tree species were planted in many sections of old field. Forested riparian corridors occur along the Illinois and La Moine rivers and a small section of upland forest is present in the southwest corner of the area. The area also includes part of Big Lake (a shallow body of open water) and several drainage ditches.

Methods

Thirteen census points have been established previously (SBA) at the La Grange Wetland Banking site. Eleven census points were established in the LGWBS in all major cover types in 2000 (see Figure 1 and Table 1) (SBA). Three additional survey points were added to the original eleven in 2003 (Figure 1 and Table 1) (SBA). Census point 7, located in the La Moine River flood plane on the north edge of the site has been dropped as a census point. All census point locations are identified in Table 1.

We sub-sampled non-linear (i.e. at least 50 m in narrowest dimension) habitat parcels using point counts (Manley et al. 1993; Ralph et al. 1993). We recorded all individuals seen or heard within a range of 75 meters (including birds seen flying over) during 10-minute count periods. These timed counts provide measures of the structure of bird communities (number of individuals and number of species) within the various habitat types. Birds detected during a point count outside the habitat type being sampled were included in the species list for the project (Table 2), but not in the seasonal census lists for that point (Tables 3, 4, 5 and 7). We also recorded all birds seen or heard within the project area outside of the 10-minute count periods. These sightings are also included in our species list for the project area.

Results

One hundred thirty-nine species representing 42 families have been recorded at the La Grange Wetland Banking Site since we were tasked to conduct avian surveys at this site (breeding 2000 and 2001, breeding and fall 2003 and all seasons 2004 through 2010) (Table 2).

Winter Season (WMS):

The LGWBS was snow covered with at least six inches of snow during the two winter survey season visits (January 12 and February 17) and access to the site was impossible therefore no timed censuses were conducted and limited number of species were recorded. To supplement the species list for winter I included several species seen during the Winter Bird count for Brown County conducted on December 17th and additional species recorded from a late Fall migration count on November 30th. Forty-seven species have been observed at the LGWBS during the six years (2004 through 2010) winter surveys have been conducted. Thirty species including one new winter record, the Short-eared Owl (Illinois State Threatened), were observed at the site during the 2010 survey period (Table 3).

One Illinois and Federally threatened species, the Bald Eagle (3 Adults and 2 Juveniles), was observed along the levy on the east end of the site on December 17th (Figure 1). I made a special effort to observe Short-eared Owls, a Illinois endangered species, during the evening of November 30th survey. At least three Short-eared Owls were detected at this time.

Spring Season (SBA):

The LGWBS was still extensively flooded during the spring migration season surveys (18 March and 21 April) and access to most of the site was still impossible therefore no timed censuses were conducted. A total of 97 species have been observed at the LGWBS during the six years (2004 through 2010) spring surveys have been conducted, 33 of which were observed in 2010. There were no new species recorded during the spring surveys (Table 4).

One Illinois and Federally threatened species, the Bald Eagle, was observed at the site during the April 21 spring visits. Two adult Bald Eagles were observed in the vicinity at the new nest during the both visits (Figure 1).

Breeding Season (WMS):

The LGWBS was still extensively flooded during the breeding season surveys (24 June and 12 August) and access to most of the site was still impossible therefore no timed censuses were conducted. The June survey was severely restricted as a result of record floods and extremely high water levels. Access during the August 12 survey was better but was restricted to the established roadway in the site. A total of 100 species have been observed at the LGWBS during the six years (2004 through 2010) breeding surveys have been conducted 51 of which were observed in 2010 including two new breeding season record, the Cattle Egret and Upland Sandpiper (Table 5). These two new species were seen during the August 12th survey, which was late in the breeding season and were not likely to be breeding at the site.

The Illinois and Federally threatened species, the Bald Eagle, was observed at the site during the June visit, however, no activity was observed near the new Eagle nest during the breeding season surveys due to limited access. Three juveniles were seen in August, however in the vicinity of the nest. Approximately 30 Upland Sandpipers, a Illinois Endangered species, were seen during the August 12th survey and were part of an early migration of assorted shorebirds.

Fall Season (WMS):

A total of 92 species have been observed at the LGWBS during the six years (2004 through 2010) that fall surveys have been conducted (Table 6). Of these, 36 species were detected in 2010 during the two visits (21 October and 30 November).

Two Illinois state threatened species, the Bald Eagle and Northern Harrier were observed during the fall migration season surveys. Two adult and one juvenile Bald Eagle were observed along the levy on the east of the site in October and three adults and two juveniles were seen in November. Two Northern Harriers were detected in October and four in November.

Discussion

Water levels or snow cover were high or deep during all four seasons except the August and October surveys during the breeding and fall migration seasons respectively. Access was generally limited to the established road during these two counts and therefore, no timed censuses were conducted in 2010.

One hundred thirty-nine species representing 42 families have been recorded at the La Grange Wetland Banking Site since surveys were tasked in 2001. Three new species were added to the cumulative list in 2010 including two Illinois state endangered species, the Upland Sandpiper and Short-eared Owl.

Bald Eagles may have nested at the site in 2010 at a newly constructed nest from 2009, however, no close observation of the established nest was possible due to high waters and thus there was no direct observation of breeding success.
