instructors for blind or deaf students.

Young educators are more attracted to Chicago and surrounding areas for certain quality-of-life aspects, said Jeff Vose, the regional superintendent for Sangamon, and Menard counties. The salaries also tend to be higher in Chicago's

suburbs, he said.

"Trying to attract young educators to smaller, rural communities seems to be one of the most challenging things in the state," Vose said.

Schools in the region are often asking substitutes to take on longer assignments, increasing class sizes or having administrators teach classes, he said.

"Teachers are spread thin," Vose said. Peoria Public Schools

is conducting virtual job fairs and expanding recruitment at universities, but ending the shortage will take a statewide effort, said Beth Crider, the regional superintendent of Peoria County.

"The ultimate battle is this: how do you reduce barriers for people to become teachers, but not reduce the quality of teacher candidates in the classroom?" she said.

Democratic Sen. Andy Manar is sponsoring a bill that would increase

the minimum wage for teachers to \$40,000 by the 2023-2024 school year. He said other possible solutions include creating a loan forgiveness program that would incentivize teacher to go to underfunded districts and making it cheaper to get a teaching license.

"We have a severe shortage of teachers in downstate Illinois," he said. "That problem's not going to change by wishing it away."

the key. People will drive for good food at a fair price. When I give you a two-piece chicken dinner, I want you to say 'wow, that's a nice chicken dinner.'"

Continued Mike, "I hope this will be a destination. I want to see people willing to wait to get a seat. That's the nice thing about having a bar on the other side. You hope they'll sit and have a couple beers while they are waiting."

Beyond the cooking part of it, Mike's 30 years of experience in construction has been a huge help in the upgrade of The Pump House Pub & Grub. He's run his own construction business for over 11 years — "That's Construction and Snow Removal LLC in Cameron. He's put in a fence in the back of the restaurant for outdoor seating (and smokers) and is planning to put a roof over three-quarters of the area for shade and when it rains. The outdoor area of the restaurant is also a great location for local lands to perform on the weekends.

"When I first walked into that kitchen (of the restaurant), the ceiling was caving in and the gutter was leaking," Mike said. "We had a serious water problem. It takes time. You have from start to finish every day."
