Work around the Carthage overpass begins May 24

SPRINGFIELD – The Illinois Department of Transportation announced that resurfacing of Illinois 110/Illinois 336 near Carthage, extending about 3 miles south and 3 miles northeast, including the interchange on- and off-ramps and U.S. 136 over Illinois 110/Illinois 336, begins May 24.

The work will reduce these roads to one lane at times, with traffic control utilizing dynamic message signs, flaggers and barricades.

This project, made possible by Gov. JB Pritzker’s historic and bipartisan Rebuild Illinois capital program, includes resurfacing techniques such as cape seals and micro-surfacing, which are expected to increase the life of the road. Work is expected to be completed by early September.

Motorists can expect delays and should allow extra time for trips through this area. To avoid the work area, when feasible, use of alternate routes should be considered. Drivers are urged to pay close attention to changed conditions and signs in the work zones, obey the posted speed limits, refrain from using mobile devices and be alert for workers and equipment.

Over the next six years, IDOT is planning to improve more than 3,300 miles of highway and 8.4 million square feet of bridge deck as part of the Rebuild Illinois capital program, which is investing \$33.2 billion into all modes of transportation. Year One included approximately \$2.7 billion of improvements statewide on 1,706 miles of highway, 128 bridges and 228 additional safety improvements.
