Torrence Avenue resurfacing begins June 1

CHICAGO – The Illinois Department of Transportation announced today that a patching and resurfacing of Torrence Avenue, from Harding Avenue, in Calumet City, to 139th Street, in Burnham, will require daily, intermittent lane closures beginning, weather permitting, Tuesday, June 1.

The project, which also includes new ADA-compliant sidewalk ramps, is anticipated to be complete in August. Access to residences and businesses within the work zone will be maintained throughout construction.

Motorists can expect delays and should allow extra time for trips through this area. Drivers are urged to pay close attention to flaggers and signs in the work zones, obey the posted speed limits and be on the alert for workers and equipment.

Over the next six years, IDOT is planning to improve 2,779 miles of highway and 7.9 million square feet of bridge deck as part of the Rebuild Illinois capital program, which is investing \$33.2 billion into all modes of transportation. Year One included approximately \$2.7 billion of improvements statewide on 1,706 miles of highway, 128 bridges and 228 additional safety improvements.
