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## **Online Enrollment**

## Please register online for all courses here.

The courses listed on the following pages constitute the Technology Transfer Training Program and are scheduled to be presented on the dates and locations indicated. These classes are all tuition-free, unless otherwise noted. Travel, meals and lodging expenses are always the responsibility of the student.

## **ENROLLMENT**

We invite your agency to enroll students in the classes you desire by completing our online <u>enrollment form</u>.

It is important that you enroll early. Some classes fill up quickly, and we may not be able to schedule additional classes. In cases of excess enrollment, some attendance restrictions will be imposed. In cases of insufficient enrollment, classes may be cancelled. Enrollment in a class will be handled in accordance.

The contact person listed on the online enrollment form will receive an email approximately 24-48 hours prior to the class confirming their registration and providing the classroom/location information. If the class fills up, the applicant will be notified by email that they have been placed on a waiting list and will be contacted if there are cancellations.

#### **CANCELLATION POLICY**

If a student is unable to attend, it is the agency's responsibility to cancel at least 24 hours prior to the class. Frequent no shows may result in your agency receiving lower priority in future enrollments.

## **CONSULTANT POLICY**

Enrollment for consultants will be allowed in all Technology Transfer training classes except for local agency only classes. Due to the popularity of our classes, we must limit each consulting firm to a maximum of four attendees per class.

#### **CERTIFICATES**

A certificate of completion will be awarded to students who successfully complete the final examination for the class. In classes where final exams are not given, a certificate of attendance will be awarded. The majority of T2 classes meet the requirements for Professional Development Hours. The number of PDHs given per class can be found with the course description; however, it is the student's responsibility to ensure that the course meets the continuing education requirements of their license.

## **FLAGGER TRAINING CHANGES**

IDOT recommends retraining flaggers every three years. Flaggers who have not met this requirment should participate in this training or use the online version of Flagger Safety training.

Flagger training sessions are scheduled regionally throughout the state. Additional trainings may be added and are announced monthly from the T2 email subscription service. Our capacity to add classes is limited, so If your agency has a training room with computer/projector access and will seat at least 50 participants and is open to employees from other agencies, please email Stephanie Stoverink or Barry Kent to be considered for a class onsite at your location.

The U.S. Department of Labor and the Illinois Department of Labor have not specifically defined flagging as a hazardous job. However, the Illinois Department of Transportation recognizes that certain hazards and risks come with the job. Therefore, registration for and participation in flagger training classes and activities are limited to participants aged 18 and up.

## Flagger Training

This class provides training to local agency personnel for day labor and maintenance activities. It meets requirements established by the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices and the Occupational Safety and Health Administration. Prerequisites: It is available to local agency highway personnel with a valid driver's license or an Illinois identification card from the Secretary of State. Topics Covered: Traffic control devices, the flagger's role in work zone safety, Illinois laws and responsibilities, and flagging procedures.

## 2024 SPRING T2 Training Course Descriptions

#### **PASER**

**Overview:** This course is intended to assist local officials in understanding and rating the surface condition of asphalt, concrete, sealcoat and gravel pavements. It will describe types of defects and provides a simple system to visually rate pavement conditions. It also will present how to use the ratings to assist in planning and budgeting. The course will consist of both classroom lecture and practicing rating roads in the field.

#### **Ameren Live Line Demo**

**Overview:** This course includes in-person training from safety experts about electricity and how to stay safe around high voltage overhead powerlines. It is well-suited for public works departments and first responders, providing lessons on how to respond in an emergency when dealing with fallen power lines/wires, whether they're on the road or if maintenance equipment accidentally comes into contact with them overhead.

## **Mastic for Pavement Repair**

**Overview:** Using Mastic's for the long-term repair of Hot Mix Asphalt and Portland Cement Concrete pavement distresses. This course is intended to describe Mastic composition, where it can be used, and how it is prepared and applied. Also, a look at how local agencies have adopted Mastic as an enduring pavement maintenance tool for the toughest repairs.

#### ADA/PROWAG

**Overview:** This seminar includes presentations by the Federal Highway Administration — IL Division and Illinois Department of Transportation that will discuss the United States Access Board's Proposed Accessibility Guidelines for Pedestrians Facilities in the Public Right-of Way (PROWAG) that will impact highway agencies. It will also provide an overview of other state and federal laws affecting access for people with disabilities in the right-of-way. TOPICS COVERED: PROWAG, ADA, EBA, and other federal/state laws and standards.

# Improve Asphalt Pavement Performance and Safety with LJS

Overview: In this training we will discuss the development, use and benefits of Longitudinal Joint Sealant (LJS) to improve the performance of HMA pavement by making the longitudinal joint area impermeable to water and air. We will also discuss improving safety when using rumble strips in combination with LJS and give an example of the use of Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) funds for this type of an application.

# Tractor Mower Operator Safety Training

**Overview:** This workshop combines both classroom and hands-on training to instruct participants on the best safety practices for industrial mower operator safety. Classroom topics include: responsible operation, safety management of hazards and risks, before-operation safety, operation safety, safety during shutdown, and safety practices during maintenance. Hands-on training topics include: equipment inspection, safety signage placement, use of checklists, safe operating techniques, and personal protective gear use.

This introductory session will explain IDOT's ADA Transition Plan initiative and help you understand available resources and how your agency should move forward with future trainings to be offered by IDOT

## ADA Self-Evaluation and Transition Plan Requirements for Local Government Agencies

**Overview:** The purpose of this training is to inform local public agencies of their responsibilities and requirements under Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) with an emphasis on the public right-of-way.
